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20 Landmarks Will Light Up for Fragile X Awareness Day

Newburyport, MA (July 15, 2019) — Today, FRAXA Research Foundation announces that 20 buildings, bridges and landmarks across the United States and Canada will be illuminated teal on Monday, July 22, to celebrate International Fragile X Awareness Day. The goal of the initiative is to raise awareness of Fragile X syndrome, the most common inherited cause of autism and learning disabilities worldwide. The illuminations will shine a spotlight on the urgent need to fund research to find effective treatments and ultimately a cure for the hundreds of thousands around the world who currently live with Fragile X.

The initiative's first lighting partner, the Niagara Falls Illumination Board, inspired a movement in which volunteers invited others to also shine a light on Fragile X. This year Niagara Falls will again light up in FRAXA's signature color, teal, along with landmarks in at least 12 US states.
